Selective schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level. Smiths Hill High School is our local selective High School.

The High Performing Students Unit administers Year 7 placement in a selective high school. This is a separate process to that of specialist high schools such as performing arts or sports high schools.

Applications for entry to Year 7 in 2020 open on 9 October 2018 and close on 12 November 2018. You must apply online by the due date. No late applications will be accepted.


