Term 4 resumes on Monday 10 October. (There is NO pupil free day at the beginning of this term).



Parents and carers are reminded that children must attend school on every school day unless they have a reasonable excuse for being away, such as illness.





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
Writing by K Banksia

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Police Visit Cyber Safety Talk

On Monday 12 September, Senior Constable Steph Burton came to talk about cyber safety to Stage 3. She discussed all things social media and gave information to students about how to protect themselves online and how to behave responsibly. Steph told students that they should not have usernames that include their real name or birthday. She said to include a favourite animal, feeling and number e.g. crazybee22. Students were also shocked to find out that the average person online gaming is a 34-year-old male. Children here would not play with adults in the playground, so it is important that they remember they are not always gaming online with people of a similar age.
