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Principal's Message

It only feels like yesterday that I was sitting here at my computer writing a welcome to Term 2 message and here I am writing the end of term message. Time has really flown!

Over these past 9 weeks the staff and students of Berkeley PS have really managed to fit in many activities, experiences, and lots and lots of learning! I have been visiting many of the teachers as they reflect on the learning that has undertaken this term and have been excited to hear of the great progress our students are making and the work they are producing. Next term we should see the results of our students in Years 3 and 5 for NAPLAN released. Our school executive use these results to work with teachers to analyse our school strengths and then assist in planning what our students need to further progress. All students will receive their Semester 1 reports today. It has been a pleasure to have read all 280 reports as it gives me a picture of the amazing work our students are doing each day and an insight of the kind and caring students who frequent our school. We look forward to welcome you all into the school next week for parent teacher interviews to discuss your child's progress.

Our hardworking P&C met with myself and Miss Davies at the beginning of the month. They have kindly agreed to donate an annual contribution of \$2000 towards the cost of our Stage 3 camps as they recognise the rising costs of camp for families and the increase of cost of living. They will donate this money each year starting this year to assist with bringing the cost of camp for each student attending. This year we have already created a costing for camp and distributed notes and payment information. As it is difficult for the office staff to make changes to the cost of an excursion we have discussed with the P&C that the donation will go towards the Year 6 Farewell for 2023 in reducing the costs of this event for families and in 2024 the donation will be put towards camp. We thank Dee and the ladies for such a generous offer in supporting our community.

Next term our teachers will return on Monday 17 July for a Staff Development Day. In this day of professional learning, teaching and support staff will be learning about managing behaviour and using behaviour plans to guide our response to students. This training will be delivered by our school Learning and Support Assistant Principal who supports our school from the Warilla Office team. 

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational
 outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 
